1. Call Meeting to Order

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Tamalpais Union High School District (District) was called to order at 5:02 p.m. A quorum was declared present.

6. Announcement of Reportable Action Taken in Closed Session

7. Approve Agenda and Review Norms

Mr. Saavedra reviewed the Board Norms. M/S/C (Oppenheim/Saavedra), unanimously, to approve the agenda.

8. Public Comment on the Consent Agenda

10. Public Comment for Items Not on the Agenda

Sophia Nowlen, Archie Williams High School (AWHS) student, spoke about healthy, locally sourced food for the school cafeteria.

Tova Bensen, AWHS SEA-DISC student, spoke to the board about the need for solar installation in a timely fashion.

Abby Nisse, AWHS, spoke about the need to replace plastic utensils with eco-friendly alternatives at the school.

Nisa Kielman-Ovetz, AWHS, shared statistics about the benefits of solar power and urged the board to install solar panels now.

Pei, RHS parent, spoke about recruiting more Advanced Placement proctors, and the need for small French classes.

Ashley Fine, AWHS, cited RHS statistics and the need to have solar panels at AWHS.

Addison Bugas, AWHS, spoke about the benefits of solar power over fossil fuels.

Leo Mohan Lewin, AWHS, spoke about equity issues for food options, requesting healthier food at the school. Emelia Reuter, AWHS, spoke of the community benefits to having solar power at AWHS.

Mia Teicher, AWHS, spoke of a possible pilot program/collaboration with Conscious Kitchen to bring locally sourced and prepared food to the school.

Jensen Merten, AWHS, spoke in favor of eco-friendly utensils, to prevent waste entering waterways.

Jaden Kughn, AWHS, spoke about how organic fresh food is more economical and healthier for the community.

Tayleigh Birkie, AWHS, expressed gratitude for the expansion of free food to all students, but asked that the funds be spent more on food and less on staffing.

Reiley Dillon, AWHS, spoke of the benefits of removing plastic utensils from the school.

Gia De Palma, AWHS, spoke of getting signatures on a petition to install solar at AWHS.

Michael Rawlins, AWHS teacher, thanked the board for listening to student concerns.

Judi Shils, founder of Turning Green and Conscious Kitchen, urged the board to listen to and support student ideas.

Colette Scafani, Drake Class of 1979, wrote a letter of concern regarding signage in the gym and the grad class of 2020 photo that says Archie Williams instead of Drake High School.

11. Student Trustee Reports

Charlie Boyden, Tamiscal High School, reported on Pathways student selections for next year, and the preparation for graduation 2022.

Lily Pashman, Tamalpais High School, reported on the senior panoramic photo, a beach cleanup, girls swimming at MCAL, Diversity Day, AP testing, and scheduling tutorial class back to mornings for next year. Jasmin Pena, San Andreas High School, reported on a successful WASC visit, and career day activities. Fiona Swan, Archie Williams High School, reported on themes for Prom week, state testing, a Unified Basketball game, and a Peer Resource led consent program.

Jack Haubold was absent, but Ms. Loebbaka read his report on Prom at City Hall, Peer resource activities, upcoming AP tests, and make-up state testing.
